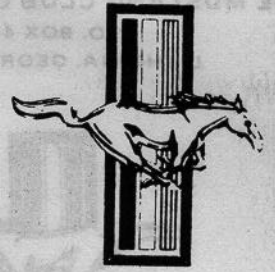

I am a member of the Model A Restorers Club, Early Ford V-8 Club, and Classic T-Bird Club, International.

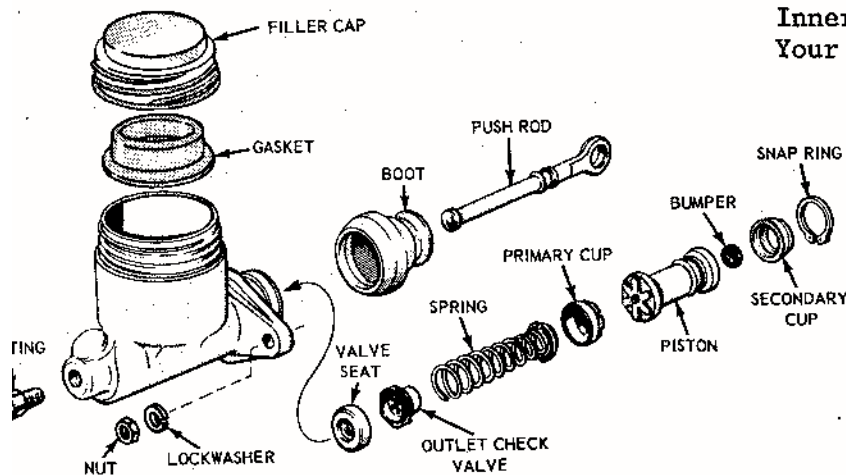
I have owned many types of Ford cars in the past, but I sincerely enjoy my Mustangs best of all.

Brake Systems

Three types of brake have been used on the Mustang. Drum brakes, the first type, have always been Bendix-designed duo-servo self-adjusting brakes, and have been the standard equipment offered in the Mustang line. Federal regulations have required the use of a dual master cylinder since 1967.

Front disc brakes, offered as an option since 1965, have been of two types. Pre-1968 models were four-piston, fixed-caliper discs. Since 1968, single-piston, floating-caliper discs have been used.

1965 Mustang Convertible

Our interest in Mustangs grew from our interest in "old cars", having first started with a 1931 A Model Ford, then a 1936 V8 sedan, both with limited drivability. Since our son is a street rod enthusiast, we too wanted a "drive anywhere" car, and our choice was a Mustang convertible. After looking for over a year, we found one looking above average. Drivability was dismissed when we realized we not only had a tank full of gas, but also a trunk full! Replacing the gas tank was a must. After scouting "junk yards" and "flea markets" we learned Ford Motor Company still had parts we could use...we took the advantage.

With a totally rebuilt motor and transmission, new rear-end, radiator, shocks, carpet and tires, we were all finished for the First National Meet. We proudly drove our little sports car with the old paint and had a wonderful time looking and learning about Mustangs and meeting all the Mustangers, and seeing James Kinney's "better than new" First National Winner.

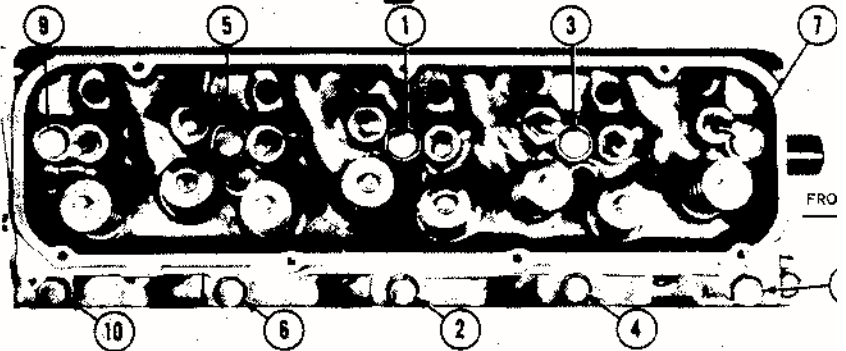

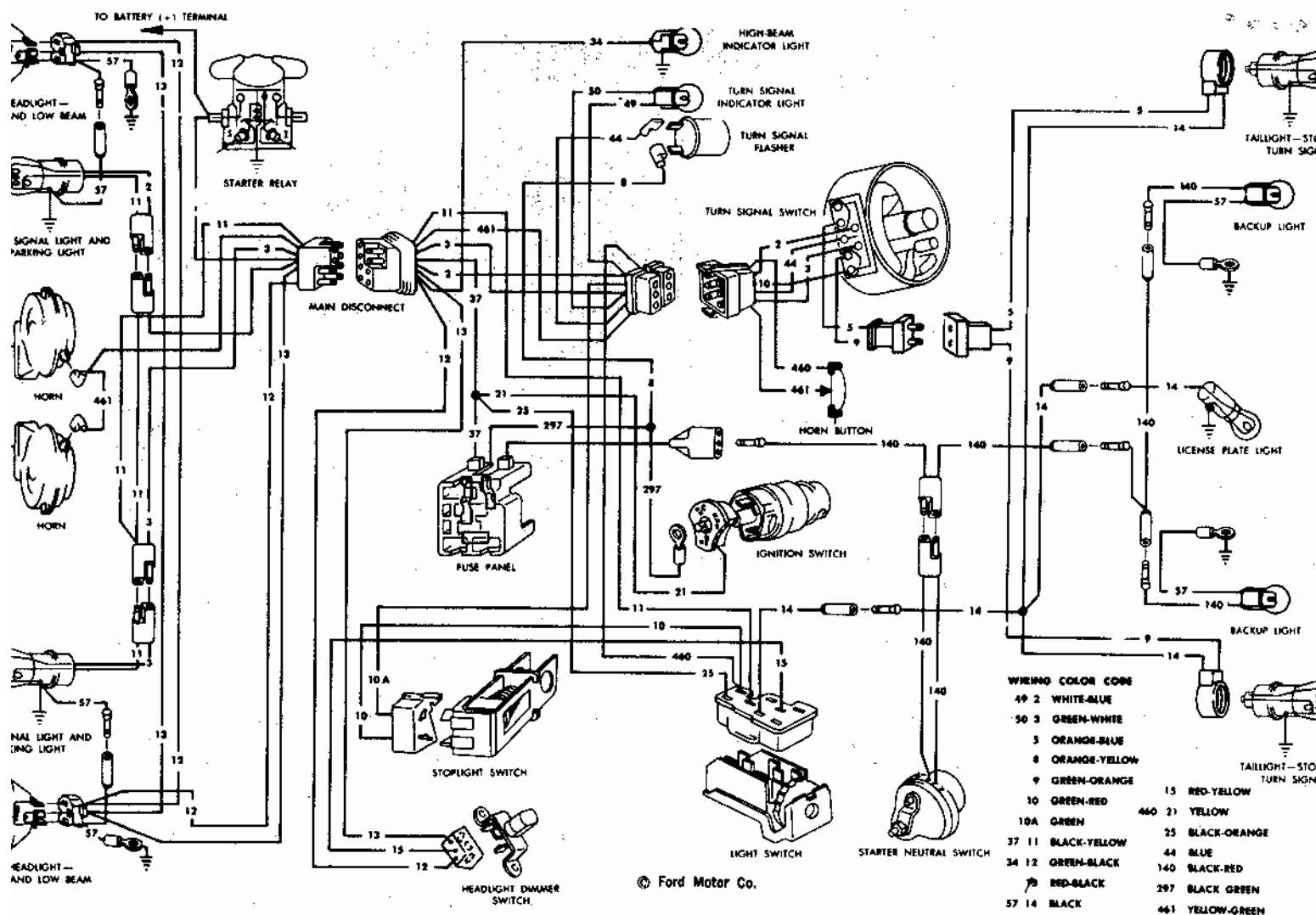
