happens to us. Then it really lets us know what friendship truly means.



A FAMILY AFFAIR


In 1981 Jim Slack started a collection of Mustangs that has turned into "A Family Affair". It had taken several years for Jim to convince me that we needed a Mustang. I had my station wagon, he had a van, a pickup, and a '67 Barracuda and I thought it totally unnecessary that a Mustang be added to the collection. However, in order to preserve my sanity and appease Jim's hankering for a Mustang, the search was on. We went to St. Louis on vacation and while there we looked in the want ads for Mustangs. We looked at one but it wasn't the one, so we went back to Tulsa still searching for a Mustang. Jim didn't want a coupe, he wanted a fastback. He didn't want a '65, he wanted a '66, so we kept on searching. He finally found a '66 fastback but it was a V-8, not a 6 cylinder. (Have you figured out he is just a little hard to please?) Well, we bought the vintage burgandy fastback with a 302 engine (wrong), '69 Mach I seats, (wrong), and automatic, (wrong). When it was towed home our 14-year-old daughter fell in love with it, Mach I seats and all. As she was born in 1966, it suddenly became hers, it was her age so it was hers. Well, the search continued.

A few weeks later, I was at work on a Saturday morning and looked in the want ads (antiques and classics of course). There it was, 6 cylinder, automatic, with air and it was blue, my favorite color. Well, it was sorta blue. It was officially silver blue but most of the blue was faded and it was almost down to silver, bare metal. Jim called me back at work and told me if I wanted to see it I best get over there quick because there were several other people looking at it. Jim had already made a deal with the owner if I wanted it. (He always leaves those decisions to me.) Just as I was writing a check for the car, someone came in to buy it. He

had had to go home after his checkbook and was just that much too late for the car.

Two months, two cars. The first one just sat in the driveway for a while. We did get another motor for it so it would run now, but the silver blue was the one that was driven. More and more the station wagon stayed at home and the Mustang was driven to work until finally the station wagon was sold. I loved the attention the fastback re-

ceived and every time I saw a convertible I looked at it real hard until I badgered and begged Jim to get a convertible. I was hooked! The silver blue car could be for the kids to drive to school. Linn would be 16 soon and a six cylinder, automatic would make good "training wheels". Again, the search was on. We were bitten by the convertible bug. Again in the antiques and classic ads there it was; a 1966 triple black convertible in pretty good




shape. October 1982, another Mustang was added to the Slack's pony corral. It was about this time that we were introduced to the Mustang club. We had been to a display and admired all the pretty cars we saw and picked up a flyer telling us all about Green Country Classic Mustang Club. I contacted the club secretary and got a few details and in December we made our first visit to the club and were the first ones to sign up for the new year.

In January, Jim bought another fastback. He had met a Mustanger at one of the swap meets who had a baby blue, 289, automatic, with air, pony interior '66 fastback that he would sell. Jim waited three months before he went to get the car, but he finally gave in. Now we have three fastbacks and a convertible. We should be happy,

right? Right!

1983 was an informative year. By attending the club meetings we were now hearing about car shows. We had also begun a friendship with the owners of Tulsa Mustang Parts. (With four Mustangs you need a lot of parts.) We had the first two fastbacks repainted and still only drove the silver blue and the black convertible. Linn had taken over the "training wheels" and I drove the convertible to work. In our visits to Tulsa Mustang Parts we had discovered the Mustang data decoder. Now we knew what was wrong with the cars. We started attending some of the car shows and even trailered our convertible to Dallas to the show, not to enter it in the show, but so we would have transportation other than the van. On the way back to Tulsa, a big area of paint just peeled off the convertible so now it needed a paint job. By this time, we were having to park the cars on the grass beside the driveway so it was decided that we would make the driveway a little larger. We now have room for twelve cars. No garage for any of the cars but we have a parking lot to put them on.

As we became more and more involved with the Mustangs, we had also become more and more involved in the club. We went to more shows and displays and sure 'nuf, Jim got bit by

the show bug. (Being bitten by all these bugs can cause a lotta problems.) But here again he was a little hard to please. He had decided he wanted a later model to show instead of an early model. Most of the club members had '65's or '66's; he wanted to be different. We started looking at the ads again (I really don't remember not looking at the ads). We found what he wanted. A one owner, 1973 convertible, 302, 3-speed, with air. But it was green. Now we all know red is the color for show cars. But it was green and green it would be. This was March 1984. The lady we bought the car from had to have our history before she would let us buy the car. She had bought it while a teenager and it was family. We told her about our ponies and told her we wanted to make a show car out of hers and she agreed to let us buy the car. Now for the restoration. The car had 91,000 plus miles on it. The paint was pretty much gone, and the interior very hard to replace. We put the car in the shop to be painted and were supposed to get it out sometime in May. We were then going to take it over to a friend's garage to start on the engine compartment and the undercarriage. Had the paint shop not been a little slow, our car would have been in Bob Mann's garage along with his yellow 1970 convertible on May 27, 1984, the day of the Memorial Day flood. Bob had over four feet of water in his garage. I'm not sure the club members who worked so hard to save Bob's car could have saved two cars. Thank God the paint shop was a mite slow!

After the flood Bob and Myrna moved from their flooded home to a new home. Since Bob's flooded house had a three-car garage that was just sitting empty until the city decided if they were going to buy it or not, it would make a perfect place to work on Mustangs. Jim spent the whole summer working on the show car. Sand blasting and painting, painting and sandblasting. But we had another problem. Even though I had not had much of a chance to drive the '73, I had driven it once or twice and I liked it. It drove and rode much better than

the '66. I wanted to drive it. Jim said under no circumstances would I be able to drive the show car and still show it. Back to the ads. Another '73 convertible, this time, 351C, automatic with air. Now we had three fastbacks and three convertibles. Something had to go. Our first convertible, the triple black, '66 was sold.

By this time, our son Charles had turned 16 and wanted a Mustang. But he was just like his Dad, he wanted something different. He wanted a '69 or '70. We looked and looked but the right one didn't appear. However, we did find a nice '68 coupe that was with its second owner and had never spent a night outside a garage, much less a night in the rain or snow. Charles decided that since he was born in 1968 it would be OK. Now we added a '68, 6-cylinder, automatic with air to our growing pony corral. Unfortunately Charles had a problem with driving. Apparently he had an invisible sign on the little '68 coupe that was visible to other cars. The sign said "hit me". After several minor fender benders, the little seafoam green coupe that we had had repainted and looking great, was totaled by a car traveling 50 mph coming off an expressway on wet pavement with no brakes. Luckily Charles and his best friend Randy suffered only minor injuries. It could have been fatal as the gas tank ruptured and both doors jammed.

As Linn had now graduated from high school and was driving back and forth to college she decided that her little vintage burgandy fastback could be made into a show car (mild custom class) and she would get her another Mustang to drive to college. (As you can see, Mustangs are all our family knows how to drive.) A 1971 Grande joined the family of Mustangs. 302, automatic, with air (the one thing the '66 fastback didn't have). And it was red. Our first red Mustang. A new set of tires and a paint job and it was ready to drive. Nearly every weekend it made the 80 mile trip between Tulsa and Miami, Oklahoma, where she was attending college.

In October of 1985, Jim was reading the antiques and classic ads as

usual and came across an ad for a 20th anniversary special edition Mustang convertible. Now I know whenever Jim reads an ad to me at 5:30 a.m. he wants me to check it out. He also had read an ad on a '65 fastback. I checked out the fastback and it had a lot of rust so I felt it was out of the question. I ignored the other ad he had mentioned as I figured it was out of the question too, it would cost too much. We had enough Mustangs, we didn't need another one. When he mentioned the ad a second time I finally called. We went to look at the car and before we left we had talk-

Oh yes, Jim finished the show car in 1984 just in time for our Green Country Mustang Show. It got its first 1st



ed the owner into looking at our fastbacks and taking his pick and thus getting the price down in our range. I had thought that a '73 Mustang was the latest model car I would ever get to own, but I was wrong. We now had a list of Mustangs that looked like this:

1 — 1966 fastback — training wheels for our youngest daughter, Patti, who was now 16 and wanting to try her wheels.

1-1968 coupe (soon to be totaled) for 17-year-old Charles to drive. We replaced the '68 with a '70 coupe, just what he had wanted in the first place. It had also been a one family

place trophy. The following weekend we were going to a show in Oklahoma City and I called the lady who had owned the car when we bought it. She was so excited that we had restored it and it had already won a 1st place trophy that she said she would see us in Oklahoma City. She wanted to see her "baby". As she was looking at the car she continually kept patting it saying "I want it back, I want it back". We won best of show with the car that day. (They weren't even going to judge it as it was the only '73 convertible there, but when Jim mentioned that he was wanting it judged so he could make

improvements on it they looked at the undercarriage and decided it would be worth judging.) We were too late to attend any of the MCA Nationals that year with the car. We had been going all year with Bob and Myrna Mann watching them win with their 1970

convertible.

The First National Show in 1985 was in March, Pensacola here we came. Our first outing at a National was a disappointment. A red convertible came in first and we brought home second place. However, at Chattanooga we were up against the red '73 again and this time we came in first. Biloxi was our next National and again we got a first place, putting us in senior division. The Grand National at Atlanta was next on our agenda, but circumstances prevented us from attending. Again at the Green Country Mustang Show we were in 1st place. Now we would have to wait until 1986 to compete in the senior division.

The first MCA show of 1986 was in Greenville, South Carolina. Jim had been working at his job 10 hours a day, six days a week for several months and he could only get Friday

and Saturday off. We left Thursday afternoon at 3:30 and were on the road for 22 hours, two of which were spent in a reststop to sleep. Friday night we attended the hospitality party for a while and then went to our room for some sleep. At 5:00 a.m. Jim was up working on the car. At 5:30 I got up to start the cleanup process. The same red '73 was here also but this time it had traveled in an enclosed trailer. We had brought our car 1,000 miles on an open trailer. It was going to be tough to beat it this time, it is a very nice car. However, when the judging was finished we came out on top. We had won our first senior division first place trophy. We're looking forward to the next national we can attend, hoping to get that second first place trophy before we retire our family's pride and joy - our 1973 green Mustang convertible and then it's back to the want ads again. This time looking for a 1971 or 1972 coupe for Jim to start on.

And our affair with Mustangs continues. Jim has been on the board of our Green Country Classic Mustang Club for the past two years and I am serving my third year as club secretary. Charles seldom wears a shirt that doesn't have the word "Mustang" on it somewhere. He even had his senior picture made in a Mustang shirt. Linn likes to drive the convertible in parades and Patti helps me get the newsletter out to club members by putting labels and stamps on them. We attend as many displays, parades and shows as possible. Sometimes we have one car at one parade and another one at a display on the same day. We had three of our cars in one parade and we usually have two or three in our local show in September. Jim had to work one weekend and I trailered the show car to the Arkansas Valley Mustang show by myself. I was very pleased but not surprised to find that Mustangers are very friendly and helpful people. Not only did my own club members help me load and unload the car, but the Arkansas club members were also very helpful.

It's fun to have an interest that every member of the family can enjoy together. I think our "Family Affair" with Mustangs will continue for a long time to come. Mustangs are great!






As a Mustang enthusiast I look forward to just about every show I go to but I was doubly excited about the Pensacola show (March 27 & 28). I had never been to one of the Gulf Coast's now-famous shows but there were plenty of older Mustangers around to raise my expectations. As show time drew near, I heard stories about bountiful fish fries, ideal show accommodations, and near-miraculous weather handling on the part of the show organizers.

It turns out that the stories are true.

The show officially started on Friday, for early registration. A well-organized group of club members (wearing two-way radio headsets!) directed cars to their spots once inside the spacious show site. There were a few newcomers like myself who found the almost non-stop rain and heavily overcast skies reasons for concern. The headset wearers didn't seem too upset about the weather. "It does this every year," one of the show veterans told me, "and every year, come show day, the sun will be shining."

Friday night, the rain stopped long enough for the Pensacola club to feed delicious, free, fish dinners to hundreds of Mustangers (although I suspect that some of those in line had snuck over from the Holiday Inn when the fish-frying smell wafted through the parking lot). The dinner alone was worth the trip and at that point it still looked bad for the show

Saturday morning showed up sunny just as show coordinator Sonja Blackwood had confidently predicted ("Every year, people come down here in the rain, get sunburned on the day of the show, then drive home in the rain."). By the







time judging began, 170 cars were inside the roped-off show area and ready for appraisal. Due to the large number of Mustangs on hand, space was at a minimum.

Saturday night was awards night. Numerous door prizes were given out along with the trophy announcements. The standing-room-only crowd overflowed the large banquet room and everyone anxiously awaited the drawing for the Senior Division 1966 red fastback. As the winning card was drawn, everyone in the room, and many of those standing in the adjacent hallway, was prepared to run up on stage to receive the keys to the giveaway Mustang. When the winning name was announced, there was no screaming, no drama. A short but strong silence filled the room until everyone realized that the winner, a local Pensacolan, had won the car but had not even showed up for the drawing. Sales from the tickets benefitted the local Children's Hospital and Ronald McDonald House.

If you've never made it to one of the Gulf Coast Roundups, you really should try to get to the 9th annual show next spring. Just remember to carry your suntan lotion for the day of the show and your umbrella for the day before and the day after.




