The Mustang Club of America Board of Directors meetings have been changed to meet on the second Tuesday every other month; April, June, August, etc.



We pulled a copy of the September, 1977 issue of *Mustang Times* out of Tony Garcia's archives and thought we'd take you on a cruise down memory lane. The Mustang Club of America had its first Grand National meet in 1976, and in the coming year 1996 we'd like to 'toughen' you up for the 20th Anniversary Celebration (and competition) by reminding you that twenty years of hard work, (and many a motorhead's main goals), have been focused around this organization. We've come along way.

In '77, the members were writing letters to then *Times* Editor, Jim Osborn. They included comments like - "There is no doubt in my mind that we will be the largest car club in America in just a few years." This comment was made by Stan Jones, Founder; a comment he made shortly after attending the Second Grand National Meet, which was held in Stone Mountain, Georgia.

Other comments from members included the following quotes we thought memorable, and some that have a strangely familiar tone.

## Wild Horses

This past Christmas my wife, Carol, gave me a sponsorship of a wild mustang. I was delighted!

There I was, a gunslinger in a Stetson riding high atop a mustang called Blizzard, climbing the flanks of a canyon heading for a forest of aspens in Comanche country, arrows flying past me like they were driven by the wind itself.

Letting this fantasy slip away it occurred to me that there was a particular reason I received this gift. You see, Carol and I own two Mustangs already. One was born in 1966 and the second two years later, both at an assembly plant in Metuchen, NJ.

The similarities between Mustang, the car and mustang, the horse are remarkable. I knew I had to acquaint the Black Hills Wild Horse Sanctuary with The Mustang Club Of America. With close to 10,000 loyal members in my club and thousands of acres of undefiled western land for my cars' symbolic namesake, (although, it was really named after the WW2 fighter plane), there was a natural hereditary relationship that was overdue to be linked.

The full page color ad was touting Ford's entry into the high performance parts business for the masses and used HOT ROD, MOTOR TREND, POPULAR HOTRODDING, AUTOWEEK, and HIGH PERFORMANCE CARS magazines to spread the word.

Even in 1969, Ford dealer promo packs referred to this market segment as "booming". Point of purchase displays were designed to help promote high performance parts at the dealership level. The ads were quick to point out how successful Ford has been on race tracks everywhere, and that their experience can help you build your engine any way you want it. Considering Ford was offering 8 different V-8 engines that year, such a program shouldn't be a surprise. What's a surprise is the fact this effort eventually evolved into the present day Ford Motorsports program and it is still going stronger than ever. - RJ

## Never Say Never Boss 302

Ford was deep into racing in the late 60's and early 70's. The HiPo 289's, Cobra Jets, and the Bosses were all cars to be taken seriously. Although most of the cars built with these engines were meant for performance, some of the HiPo's and Cobra Jets broke the rules and found themselves not only pushing horsepower to the pavement, but also to a myriad of power equipment, including performance robbing air conditioners.

Every true blue Mustang enthusiast knows that Ford made sure there were exceptions to this rule, and the Boss 302 or Boss 429 Mustangs were these exceptions. Ford promised no automatic transmissions or air conditioning on the Boss 302 or Boss 429, and although they were standard equipped with power brakes and steering (on the Boss 429), they were not considered overburdened with power assist equipment. Did you ever wonder what it would have been like to have had the total performance of a Boss 302 and the comfort of cold factory air conditioning in one package?

Mustang/Shelby Club and MCA member did. And it turns out, that is exactly what he now owns! Before you say, "Never, no way", read on.

Michael has owned many Mustangs in the past, but he has always wanted a Boss 302. Michael found out about a tired Boss 302 parked in the back yard of a house and tried to buy the car 8 years ago. It was sporting a set of Cragar S/S wheels and the body had been painted white with a paintbrush. Having never seen the car up close, he only knew it was a Boss 302.

About 3 1/2 years ago, the owner decided to sell the car, a total basket case as Michael describes it. Having always wanted a Grabber Green with white interior Boss 302, Michael thought about restoring this car to his dream specs. After closely examining the deteriorating condition of the car, the thought of parting it out crossed Michael's mind. Close inspection revealed plumbing holes in the firewall for the factory air. There were air conditioner parts in the trunk, and the plumbing on the inside on the car was intact. Everyone said there

were never any Boss 302's built with air. Exhaustive research with Randy Delisio, who was put in charge of the restoration, revealed it was in fact a factory air car, so the decision was made not to part it out and not to make it a Grabber Green Boss, but to restore it to its Wimbledon White original specifications.


The original Boss 302 was thoroughly rebuilt by PCHS in Long Island. The motor is stock externally, but internally is slightly modified to maximize the performance of the high revving Ford small block. The motor and entire car were painstakingly restored to Concours Trailered standards with the help of Gary Duprez. The many hours of hard work seem to be paying off. The Boss took the "Best of Show" award in a local Mustang Show out of a field of 120 Mustangs. Its debut at SAAC-20 in Atlanta saw the car constantly being scrutinized by curious onlookers who all seemed stunned by this rare beauty.

Michael was able to obtain the factory to dealer invoice on the car, which was two pages in length due to the many options on this car. The car was sold to Ford Motor Company in Dearborn, and shipped to the Ford Central Office Building Garage, where it was a Ford executive car in the early years. The car has some

very rare and unusual options which include the rectangular electric clock, console and convenience check group with the standard black vinyl interior, tachometer, SportSlats, rear spoiler, and would you believe AM/FM stereo radio, tilt steering, intermittent wipers, tinted glass, and front bumper guards with the front spoiler! Rounding out the option list was the Shaker hood scoop, F60 Wide Oval belted tires mated to 15 x 7 Magnum 500's, power steering with the optional Rim-Blow steering wheel, and a host of other factory options.




## "Concept 1" from HMS Motorsports

HMS Motorsports of Marblehead, Massachusetts is offering fifty (50) of their "Concept 1" Mustangs to an equal number of lucky Mustang drivers. This car is the result of a combined effort to present a special vehicle to Ford Motor Company showcasing brand new lighting systems from Osram Sylvania. You will notice this car's unique headlights-which are thinner and wider than stock- almost before you notice its special body panels.

The brutish exterior design of the "Concept 1" gives this Mustang an even more aggressive look than usual. Every bulge, scoop and vent is functional and designed to make this 351 powered beast run faster, cooler, or more efficiently.

As if exclusive bodywork wasn't enough, the "Concept 1" Mustang can be ordered with any of five "flip-color" paint jobs. These special paint flavors actually change color right before your very eyes. It's all a matter of the lighting and the angle you view the car. Our subject car is the blue/green version and appears as a deep cobalt blue, or a bright teal green.



The interior has also been upgraded with 2-tone leather seats front and rear. Brazilian Rosewood trim give the dash area an additional touch of class. A Pro-5.0 shifter and a high powered stereo package brings even more enjoyment to the driver of the "Concept 1" Mustang.

The 351 Windsor under the special fiberglass hood puts out a stimulating 300 horsepower thanks to the use of a Ford Motorsports GT-40 performance package. This kit comes with aluminum heads, GT-40 upper and lower intake, 1.7 roller rockers, a 65mm throttle body and 1-5/8" stainless steel headers. A 3.55 rear end gear adds a final spin to the equation.

This car's powerplant has a serious sound to it that is further enhanced with a stainless steel Borla cat-back exhaust system.




Suspension is a serious subject on the "Concept 1" so it should be no surprise this area was also extensively upgraded. H&R springs lower the car 1-3/4 inches and Bilstein gas shocks control the springs. All stock bushings have been replaced with Poly-Urethane units for more accurate steering response. Wheels are 17x8 O.Z. and come shod with 255/45ZRx17 tires.

Naturally, a car like this deserves the very best in brakes, so that's what it comes with. Baer Racing supplied 13" vented and drilled front units along with 12" vented and drilled rear discs. Carbon fiber brake pads are the final link in this 'whoa' connection.

As you can see, the 'boys in the lab' have put together a very impressive and desirable package. I can just see myself driving one into a National MCA show 15 years down the road. Top photo - To me, this particular wheel and brake package may be the best looking ever. I just love seeing brakes like this peaking out from behind trim 5-spoke wheels. Of course if this were my car, I'd have to paint the wheels black so I could *really* see those brakes. Middle photo - Because of this car's form-follows-function approach, the side vents are larger than stock and *active* as they pull in air to cool the rear brakes. Bottom photo - The 351 Windsor fits in the Mustang's engine bay just like it did in our wildest dreams. A realistic 300 horsepower is guaranteed to give the competition nightmares.

# Ask Fred??



...from Glazier's Mustang Barn

Dear Fred,

I am a new member who has just joined your club. I have loved Mustangs for as long as I can remember. I have owned a 1966 hardtop and now own two Mustang convertibles, a 1973 and a 1983. Recently, my wife and I have decided to completely restore our 1973 and have been told by many people that it is important to keep it the original color. We have been told that changing the color, even if it is a factory color, will dramatically decrease the value of our car. Is this true? Thanks for your opinion.

Dear Tony,

*This is a frequently asked question. I usually suggest that the value of the car is reduced by the cost of a repaint. However, I also suggest that if you are keeping the car for yourself and don't intend to use it for show, the color that you like the best is certainly the color you should paint it.*

Dear Fred,

Fred, I need your help! I have a 1967 Mustang with a 351W (1972) engine. In the last 1,000 miles I have changed my distributor, the points, condenser, cap and rotor twice. The engine will run great, then all of the sudden start backfiring and running rough at idle and under-accelerating and decelerating. The voltage to the coil is about 12 volts with engine running and with the engine off but the key on. My question: is it the ignition, switch, or a resistor. If it's the resistor, how do I find it and fix it.

Dear Paul,

*The symptoms that you describe certainly sound like an electrical problem. You don't mention that you have changed the coil. Possibly the problem is starting when the engine reaches operating temperature and the coil is breaking down. It also could be a problem with the ignition switch, but I doubt the ignition resistor is creating the problem. The ignition resistor is actually*

*a resistance wire that is part of the underdash harness between the switch and the coil.*

Dear Fred,

I want to know if an engine out of a 1969 LTD XL, 429 CID + C6 Auto Trammy) will fit into a 1969 Mustang SCJ engine compartment?

Also, would the same engine (429) fit in a 1970 BOSS 302 body?

I am into big blocks and the 429 BOSS bodies are like hens teeth; very rare or impossible to find.

Do you have a NOS exhaust system for a 1969 Cobra Jet 428 or used one in good condition? I have a 1969 with 37,600 miles, original paint, upholstery, carpet, and engine. I presently have it in the unrestored class and took Silver Award at the National in Cherokee, North Carolina last month.

Thanks for your help! I enjoy your articles in the *Mustang Times* very much.

Dear Bob,

*The engine conversion you have in mind should be fairly easy, with the use of engine mounts built for this purpose by Ford Power Parts, Inc.; 14504 S. Carmenita; #C; Norwalk, CA; 90650; (310) 921-5300. You will also need the C6 transmission crossmember, to clear the transmission. The driveshaft may have to be altered or replaced, but custom shafts can be made for under \$200. Headers are available for the conversion, although I recommend cast iron manifolds for most street use. This conversion should be equally easy in your 428 or 302 body; or, for that matter, a six cylinder cody. Bear in mind the 428/BOSS 302 shock towers were especially reinforced for high performance driving.*

Dear Fred,

Greetings from California. I have a 1965 fastback GT (complete with the original window sticker and invoice). My problem is in the fog lamp wiring harnesses that run from the main under-hood harness to the fog lamps themselves. These identical harnesses are about 19 inches long. Each has one gray conductor and one black conductor with male bonded insulated bullet terminals at the main harness end and spade lugs with an oversized bonded insulator at the fog lamp end. Each has a black plastic sleeve about 12 inches long and two opposing rubber fed through the lamp housing and the grille.

My problem is that both harnesses have one bullet connector each, broken off at the main harness attachment end. I am very reluctant to crimp on just any bullet terminal. The Ford Motor Company does not stock replacement harnesses and aftermarket

substitutes work electrically, but are not even close physically. Splicing on a short new section of wire with the correct bullet terminal under the plastic sleeve seems to be my only choice; unless, there are companies that make up complete replacement harnesses. Do you know of a company that has or is willing to provide the service of attaching duplicate Ford bullet terminals with the bonded insulator on broken wires? Or, do you know of a repair kit that will do the same thing? I also have a couple of the suppression capacitors, the ones that attach to the regulator and alternator, with the same missing bullet terminal problem. Can you help?

Dear Jim,

*The easiest solution to your fog lamp pigtail wire problem is to replace the pigtail wires with new reproduction wires available from several sources. These are black/black, but otherwise identical to your description. Virtually all the original fog lamp pigtails I have seen were black/black. The easiest way to replace the other connectors you mention is to select an appropriate lead wire, such as the fog lamp ground wire, (for male ends) and solder and shrinktube the repair. If the repair is concealed in the wrapping tape, you will have a safe, reliable, and show-ready repair.*

Dear Fred,

I have recently acquired a 1969 SportsRoof and I have several questions. The windshield tag reads 9T02Q128689. The fender tag reads (in the top left corner) 56. Then, on the second line of the fender tag; 12 13L 63A 2A. On the third, it reads 9T02Q128689 P Med Blu M. Then, on the fourth line, it reads GT DE. The door tag is missing, so I don't have any firm information there. I am wondering how rare, if at all, this car is? I can see the remains of a GT stripe in the door jams. Is it a GT car? It also has staggered rear shocks, a 9" rear end, and heavy duty suspension. Could this be a "Drag Pak" car? Also, could this be a 428 Super Cobra Jet with a 4-speed toploader?

I'm planning on restoring the car to near factory original, but would like to put disc brakes, power steering and a deluxe interior, with a fold-down rear seat, as well as rear louvers, a rear wing, and maybe paint that is a darker shade of blue (Acapulco Blue). Would these changes downgrade the value for a later sale? Also, how do I tell what gear ratio I have? And, can you tell me the difference between the Cobra Jet and the Super Cobra Jet engines? Is the 4-speed toploader out of a 1969 Torino the same as the Mustang? I have to find a motor and a transmission. I don't want to buy the wrong parts. Any leads on how and where to get these big items would be great. Thanks for your

help. I wish I had the door tag information, so you would have more to go on.

Dear David,

*The remains of the GT stripe, and particularly the lack of a "TT" on the buck tag would indicate that you have a GT. The "TT" would have been on the tag if it had been a Mach 1 - this indicates the black hood paint. The staggered shocks were supplied on the 428, 4-speed cars.*

*The changes you list to the mechanical and trim areas will do little to enhance the value, and will throw any history you have for the car out the window. This is true of the color change as well. The lack of the options you list is probably why the car is a GT - some of them were standard on the Mach 1, such as Deluxe interior. The power steering would drain a few horsepower, and all of these items would add weight, which the original owner sacrificed in order to maximize the speed of the car (as well as save a few bucks). My advise is that you should consider saving these bucks also, since they will run into the thousands, or at least concentrate them on the missing items, such as the engine and transmission.*

*The easiest way to identify a 428 SCJ car is by the rear axle ratio, which would be 3.91:1 or 4.30; or by the radiator support modifications for the engine oil cooler. The Warranty Code could be "R" or "Q", just like the CJ, but the block assembly of the engine was specially built to withstand the higher RPM's that the axle ratio would produce. The most obvious feature is the harmonic balancer, C8AE-6316-C, 7-1/2" in diameter. The speedometer cable was connected to the transmission of the "Drag Pak" cars with an adapter.*

*The easiest way to determine the rear axle ratio is to raise the rear wheels off the ground on jack stands, put the car in neutral, and turn the driveshaft until both rear wheels turning together have made one turn. Count the number of turns required to do this, such as three and a half. This example would be 3.50:1.*

*The tailshaft of the Torino transmission would have to be altered to correctly locate the shifter, but the engine would be virtually identical. The least expensive way to obtain a transmission is to locate a Mustang transmission, unless you get a major deal on the Torino unit.*

*What you have is a rare, fast, beautiful, fun, driving car that would turn a lot of heads when restored to its original condition.*

## Suncoast Celebrates Fifteen Years








# K-Code Restoration






so he could be assured of a solid car to work with. His search led him through a string of contacts who connected him to the owner of this western raised 1967 K-code. The car's owner sent Randy three photos of the Mustang that had been taken five years earlier. That's all it took for Randy to send the owner a check. Three weeks later during a 10 degree evening, a car carrier pulled up in front of Randy's house with the new addition to the Dunn family. Randy immediately put the Mustang in his garage so he could begin *playing* with it right away. He said, "It looked like it had been painted with latex paint that was 15 years old, but I didn't care. It was a solid, 95 percent rust free '67 K-code, and it was mine!"

The day after receiving this car (January 15th, 1995) Randy started taking it apart and taking pictures of the process. After all, this was one of just 472 K-codes made that year. It is also one of a mere 35 in the K-code Registry. And considering this car had never been damaged, or sustained any rust, Randy had more than enough motivation to give it the royal treatment.


This car was originally a California car, or a K-code with smog controls. It's Wimbledon White with standard 2-tone blue interior. Mechanically, the Mustang runs a C-4 and a 3.50 rear gear to keep things lively. On the car's very first outing it grabbed a 2nd place trophy at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway last July. From a car hauler by necessity, to the banks of Indy just for fun...now that's a happy ending.
